

4. First-Aid Measures

7. Handling and Storage

(a) Precautions for safe handling

The capacity recoveryrate in the delivery state (50% capacity of fully charged) after storage is assumed to be 80% or more. The voltage for along time storage shall be 6V~8.4V range. Do not storage Rechargeable Li-ion Battery haphazardly in a box or drawerwhere they may short-circuit each other or be short-circuited by other metal objects. Keep out of reach of children.
