2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

DANGER. CORROSIVE. CONCENTRATE. CAUSES SKIN AND EYE BURNS. HARMFUL OR FATAL IF SWALLOWED. NEVER USE OR MIX WITH ACIDS, AMMONIA OR ANY OTHER CHEMICAL.

Principle routes of exposure: Eye contact. Skin contact. Inhalation. Ingestion.
Eye contact: Corrosive. Causes permanent eye damage, including blindness.
Skin contact: Corrosive. May cause permanent damage.
Inhalation: May cause irritation and corrosive effects to nose, throat and respiratory tract.
Ingestion: Corrosive. Causes burns to mouth, throat and stomach.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye contact: Immediately flush eyes with running water for at least 15-20 minutes, keeping eyelids open. Get medical attention immediately.

Inhalation: If breathing is affected, remove to fresh air. Get medical attention immediately.

Handling:

Avoid breathing vapors, mists or dusts. Do not taste or swallow. Product residue may remain on/in empty containers. Storage:

Keep tightly closed in a dry, cool and well-ventilated place. Protect from freezing. Keep out of the reach of children.
